***Two scholarships (one male and one female) are available for all fields of post-secondary study that award a certificate and/or diploma upon completion.**
Due April 15th

Criteria for applicants –

Only complete applications will be given consideration for selection.

Please **print** all information.

Applications must be postmarked no later than April 15th to be considered for selection.

Scholarship monies will only be paid to the successful applicants that pursue post-secondary studies and meet other criteria stated herein.

This scholarship may only be awarded to Killdeer Public School graduates.

Applicant information will be verified by using provided application information.

General Information –

The Scholarship Committee shall choose one male student and one female student with strong work ethics, who are financially deserving, and *who have academic potential for post-secondary success. *(As determined by the scholarship committee)

The scholarship values are currently \$1,000.00 per scholarship, but are determined by Allan and Kaye Dolezal.

The recipients of the scholarships shall receive all of the scholarship money once copies of the respective course/semester bills, i.e. tuition, book costs, and/or room and board costs have been submitted to the Administration of Killdeer Public Schools, generally after completing first semester. Unclaimed scholarships may be reassigned by Allan and Kaye Dolezal.

The scholarship committee shall consist of the superintendent, secondary principal, career counselor, one junior high school teacher, and one high school teacher from Killdeer Public School along with Allan and Kaye Dolezal.

The scholarship committee will make a determination as soon as possible after the April 15th application deadline. The scholarships will be presented to the selected applicants at graduation.
